Campers will need to sign that they have a copy of the policy.

Chad will contact the Town Forester for a walkthrough to discuss new trails and potential timber cut.

Samantha Lazo introduced herself and she is interested in joining the committee. She is an Environmental Scientist by trade.

Motion to recommend having Samantha join the committee was made my Ms. Champney. Mr. Decker seconded. All approved. Meadow will invite Samantha to meet the board.

Ms. Wysocki update Commission on the potential sale of town property on Griffin Road and will need to research if it has a conservation easement.
